Inclusion Summit 2022

The aim was to share information and help people understand SEND and inclusion. Workshops on the day included: race and culture in the curriculum / governance, inspiring change, keys to inclusion, LGBQT support, supporting health needs in Education and in employment also. Was a wonderful day and very productive.

Local Offer Update

The Local Authority have recruited a project lead to oversee the re-design of the Local Offer which has been an area of concern for many of our families and highlighted in the SEND Ofsted inspection. The Local Offer should provide SEND families with details on services available throughout the city as well as being a source for information. Many of you have voiced concerns over not knowing what is available within the city, not having contact with services directly and generally not being updated on where you can access help and information. We are actively working with partners to ensure the Local Offer contains the information you need and will update you with all progress

Consultations in the Community and Improving Accessibility and Inclusion within Wolverhampton

V4P provided Feedback to The Grand Theatre and Arena theatre on how to make shows more accessible and inclusive. This included but wasn't limited to, alterations to entrances and rest rooms, quiet performances at various times and show and carer tickets and also captions. This is wonderful news! V4P were also able to discuss with The Way, new in inclusive sessions and what they would need to look like and how they would best work to be all inclusive to all SEND Families.

Financial Wellbeing Partnership Board

Ensuring that that the needs of our families are heard at Board level and considered in ALL financial support offered by Wolverhampton Local Authority.

As part of the Financial and wellbeing Strategy we informed you about in our last Newsletter, Warm Spaces will be launched by Wolverhampton Council from 24th October 2022- opening up community hubs and Libraries as Warm Spaces to families where you can grab a warm drink, food and charge devices/batteries and mobility equipment as well as being in a warm environment where you can meet other families. There is a shuttle service provided free of charge if needed that can pick you up and drop you back home and this is offered all week (including weekends) better still there is no need for a referral, simply call Wolverhampton Council Customer services to book. Emotional and well-being board

Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) have been trying to overcome national recruitment issues by taking a different approach to staffing—they've appointed an Occupational Therapist (OT) and a Speech And Language Therapist to work in specialist CAMHS.

SENCO Network Launch

SENCO's are teachers that have responsibility for assessing, planning and monitoring the progress of children with SEND.

The SENCO network is up and running again for the new academic year and V4P have been involved in planning the new sessions aimed at helping new SENCO's engage with parents.

Keep In Touch Meetings

We meet regularly with Senior Staff within the Local Authority and NHS/ Clinical Commissioning Group to ensure all feedback is captured and presented to the correct people to inform on what is working well and not so well. We meet weekly with the Deputy Director of Education and Inclusion Manager, we meet monthly with the Deputy Director for Children's Social Care, Alison Hinds and monthly with the Head of Joint Commissioning, we also meet monthly with Health officials and the Designated Medical Officer for Wolverhampton. We can only report back on what you tell us - please keep contacting us and letting us know what your experiences are with services both good and bad - we can only influence change with your help.
