Following our annual survey, Voice 4 Parents have reviewed all your feedback and set the following priorities for the next 12 months:

High Priority

- Co production Strategic and family co-production need to ensure clear understanding of true coproduction on all levels, mutual respect, whole family approach and being heard
- ASD pathway, pre diagnostic support, post diagnostic support and support through the whole pathway, 3 pathways (confusion on timescales etc), really unclear, more progress to be made on Autism Board, Black Country & ICB work
- Mental Health & Wellbeing what is Wolverhampton's Mental Health offer, CAMHS and all services, support for the whole family, feedback from families show that families can't get support as their child has other SEND needs, Services don't understand the SEND need to make therapy accessible, 12 week phone call families feel this is a tick box. Families need support when they ask for it not when things hit a crisis, families don't feel listened to. Discharges 50% felt this was inappropriate and families didn't know how to re access or get further support, no exit plan. Clear and appropriate documents presented at SEND Board (data etc)
- Leisure /HAF. Leisure need to ensure engagement with SEND community so they can access in their Local Community including Parks, Leisure Centres etc to make sure they are SEND appropriate and all staff have a clear understanding and correct information is available to families. HAF families feedback that HAF is not accessible for SEND families and doesn't always meet SEND criteria (0 to 25)
- Social Care DCYP team role, Short Break although work has started, still need to get access and assessment right and information regarding Wolverhampton Short Break offer and criteria. Carers assessment. Direct payments
- Education EHCPs as a whole with a particular focus on Annual reviews and personal budgets. Transitions, reasonable adjustments, graduated response familes need to have a clear understanding of graduated response, a document needs to be produced that is parent friendly (we are yet to see this even though there has been conversations that is has been produced), schools need to meet more with familes and adopt a whole family approach. Exclusions and suspensions. EHCP Hub and Invision 360, quality assurance and auditing
- Health Health Personal Budgets, access to therapies, waiting list for services, LDA annual health check. Information regarding what the offer is from each service and how therapy is delivered.
- Joint Commissioning (Joint Commissioning brings together education, health and social care, to share an understanding of what is needed by children, young people and their families) - we recognise for all the above to work JC work need to drive this
- Cost Of living is also a growing crisis for SEND families

Priorities (as work is happening but still get quite significant feedback regarding these from families)

Feedback Meeting with Inspire

Voice 4 Parents Steering Group members met with Team Leaders from Inspire to discuss feedback from our annual survey. We raised concerns around waiting list, criteria, appropriate support, therapies being adapted, issues around families get refused due to other SEND needs, discharges. We also discussed changes to areas that Inspire can support with and how this needs to be communicated with families. In the coming months we hope to share updated information regarding the offer from Inspire and their criteria, we also plan for the service to attend a V4P coffee morning. Following on from meeting with Inspire we have also requested to meet with other professionals / services so we can share our annual survey findings.

Co Production Meeting

A V4P rep has now attended Invision training (tool used to audit the quality of EHCP's) and will start auditing from Oct 2023.

V4P has fedback that parents need more information regarding decision making panels and the agreement that parents/carers be informed of these and their purpose before they take place

Send Partnership Board Meeting

V4P Annual survey results have now been shared with all partners at the Local Authority Send partnership board which covers education, health and social care. This should inform services of what parents feel is working well and what isn't so services can improve where needed.

Action plans are to be drawn up based on the annual survey by Health partners and inform the Local authority on their Self-evaluation and priorities going forward.

Keep in touch meeting with Strategic partners

Our normal keep in touch meetings with professionals have restarted after the summer holidays After feedback...

We discussed recent transport issues, v4p priorities based on families feedback and discussed the send partnerships self evaluation with the local authority.

With our health partners we discussed cambs and the autism/adhd pathways in Wolverhampton and across the black country as well as how services needed to work better together.

When meeting with social care, we discussed carers assessments with a view to arranging a meeting to fully feedback what families feel Is needed in regards of help and support via carers team and short breaks
