One Send Portal

On 18th April 2023, V4P attended a Kick of meeting to look at the "One Send Portal". This is the proposed online platform that SENSTART is developing to replace the previous EHCP hub. This is being developed alongside support from Capita, the IT developer. We were shown an initial idea of how this platform can be used and adapted to meet the needs of Wolverhampton. It will be a add on local authority system to share information such as reports from your child/young persons professionals, a communication tool between SENSTART and the local authority on EHCP assessments and annual reviews. etc

The meeting was attended by representatives from Health, Education, and Social Care as well as V4P. 5 further meetings are to follow to develop the design setup, training for SENSTART, and pilot training for parents and school Senco's, along with the Live set up and Post Go live review.

A further workshop with V4P and school representatives has been arranged for 6th June 2023. Department for Education representatives will be leading on this workshop. We will keep you updated as we progress.

A truly delightful day at Woodfield Primary School

Voice 4 Parents are delighted to attend the community day at Woodfield primary School on April 26th.

Along with other professionals, we discussed SEND in young children with families of the school. This included how to identify traits and needs and how to support those needs to achieve the best possible outcomes, with a particular focus on Autism and ADHD as these were identified by families in advance of being of key interest.



Talks were held by various parties, including Voice 4 Parents, on who we are and our roles within the city. Parents were then able to chat with visiting speakers on a 1:1 basis.

It was a brilliantly productive day.

Joint Commissioning Audit Completed

This month Voice 4 Parents have worked with the Local Authority and Black Country Trust to complete the Joint Commissioning audit, where we work to identify needs, recognising and developing the support for priorities of SEND. These are for Wolverhampton up to 2025. Priorities include but are not limited to the Autism Pathway, Mental Health support, ADHD and Short Breaks. We are pleased that these are the priorities identified by families that have fed back to V4P.

Children and Young People Emotional Health and Wellbeing Needs Workshop

V4P attended the Children and Young People Emotional Health and Wellbeing Needs Workshop along with partners across the City, including Education, Health, Public Health and Voluntary Sector to name a few. The aspiration is to draw together information to provide a better support system for Children and Young People within Wolverhampton by looking at what Wolverhampton currently offers and what is needed to improve Mental Health Services. Over the next month or so, consultations and focus groups will be held with families by Anna Freud Centre (who are carrying out the data finding and analysis on behalf of Wolverhampton and local NHS Partners).

This is a welcome opportunity for Voice4Parents and our families, who have reported Mental Health as being a top priority for Children and Young People as well as their families - we will update on this work as soon as we receive further details on how you can also be involved.

Wolverhampton LA have now recruited a Quality Assurance Officer who will be responsible for auditing Education Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) to ensure that Wolverhampton plans are of high Quality - welcome to Lucy Newman. Voice 4Parents will hopefully be involved in this work and will be ensuring all your feedback is taken into account.
